The Lessons

The Old Testament Lesson Isaiah 65:15b-25

Reader A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

You shall leave your name to my chosen to use as a curse, and the Lord God will put you to death; but to his servants he will give a different name. Then whoever invokes a blessing in the land shall bless by the God of faithfulness, and whoever takes an oath in the land shall swear by the God of faithfulness; because the former troubles are forgotten and are hidden from my sight.

§ If you choose not to remain for the Labyrinth Walk, please leave quietly out of respect for those who would like to stay. Thank you.

Notes about a labyrinth

The labyrinth is a place set aside for prayers, for listening, and for receiving that which God offers you at this moment. Walking the labyrinth is a path of prayer, a walking meditation and is different for everyone. You may want to focus on that which you want to release, to let go and to offer to God for transformation – receive the gift that God offers. Continue your journey back into the world ready for a newness of life, new beginnings, and new birth. May the seeds you plant this day come to fruition.

A Labyrinth is unicursal – the way in and the way out is ONE PATH with ONE CHOICE: to enter or not. The entrance signifies birth, the center God. Modern mystics use the labyrinth to achieve contemplative states. It quiets the mind amidst outside noises.

Some guidelines:

- o Please maintain physical distancing.
- You may walk with or without shoes.
- Pause at entrance.
- You may focus (one word or thought or prayer) and begin.
- o Find and honor your own pace and the rhythm of your breath. You may find yourself moving more quickly or more slowly than others and it will be necessary to safely pass or allow others to safely pass. Moving around one another is key to discovering and staying with one's own flow. Respect the pace and space of others.
- Experience it in your own way and then reflect upon it. Your experience may be revealed over time.

A map of the labyrinth experience:

- * Purgation: to cleanse, to release, to let go of, to quiet, and to shed.
- Illumination: Walk with an open heart and open mind, receive what is there for you to receive.
- * Union: In essence we realize that we are the hands of God, we are the ones who must take action on behalf of the Divine. If there is to be healing, it is up to us to initiate it. In union we are encouraged to take on a larger life.

The offices are open for normal office hours and visitors may ask at the office to be let in to the cathedral. Most of the staff will continue to work at home for much of the time.
