Reception of the Body

The Dean meets the body at the door of the church and says

With faith in Jesus Christ, we receive the body of our brother Joe. Let us pray with confidence to God, the Giver of life, that God will raise him to perfection in the company of the saints.

The Dean asperges the coffin.

Silence may be kept, after which the Dean says

Deliver your servant, Joe, O Sovereign Lord Christ, from all evil, and set him free from every bond; that he may rest with all your saints in the eternal habitations; where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

Let us also pray for all who mourn, that they may cast their care on God, and know the consolation of his love.

Silence may be kept, after which the Dean says

Almighty God, look with pity upon the sorrows of your servants for whom we pray. Remember them, Lord, in mercy; nourish them with patience; comfort them with a sense of your goodness; lift up your countenance upon them; and give them peace; through Iesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Joe Letzkus School Teacher, 1973

Joseph Edward Letzkus, the son of Rose (Teresi) and Joseph Letzkus, was born in Pittsburgh, PA, on October 20, 1939.

He was preceded in death by his Sicilian grandparents, Freda and Joseph Teresi. Also, by his sister Barbara Coultas and brother John Letzkus. Left to cherish his memory are his sister Judy Bejarano, many nieces, nephews, and loving friends.

Joe went to Saint Charles Academy, Mission Bay High School, USD and graduated in 1968 from SDSU with an elementary K-8 teaching credential. He began teaching in 1969 in the La Mesa / Spring Valley School District. He retired 20 years later to get his real estate license. He was a member of the greater San Diego Business Association and the Hillcrest Business Association. He volunteered for Chris Kehoe's City Council race from day one to election in 1983. In 1993, he purchased Flick's bar and became an activist in the LGBT community. He served as co-chair for the San Diego LGBT Center's Gala with Chris Shaw. He was inducted into the International Imperial Court by John Laird, Grey Wolf Emperor 21. His investiture was done by Queen Mother of the Americas, Nicole M. Ramirez. Joe traveled to the Vatican with the Mission San Diego Choir at the invitation of Pope John Paul II to sing the Easter Sunday Mass in St. Peter's Basilica. He joined St. Paul's Cathedral to become their Convener for the LGBT lay ministry. Joe held forums and workshops to educate members about transgender issues and to have discussion and to bring awareness to school bullying. In June 2019, Joe produced an event at Flick's to remember the third anniversary of the Pulse Nightclub shootings. He added a fundraiser for the Matthew Shepard Foundation and raised more than \$2,100 for the event. Joe supported local LGBT candidates running for local and state offices. His 80th birthday



was held at Flick's as a fundraiser for Todd Gloria who was running for Mayor of San Diego. The opportunity to give back brought Joe much joy. He will be missed deeply.
