Speakers at Tonight's Service

The Very Rev. Penny Bridges has served since 2014 as the Dean, or Senior Pastor, of St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral. She is committed to bringing people together across divisions and creating inclusive and loving community.

Bishop Cornelius Bowser Since 2012, Bishop Bowser has directed Shaphat Outreach, a ministry of Charity Apostolic Church, that helps youth and adults involved in gang or gun violence make positive life changes through cognitive-behavioral therapy, wraparound services, and educational classes.

Bevelynn Bravo founded Mothers with a Message, an organization supporting mothers who have lost children to violence. Along with board members Alejandra Fuerte, Tracey Swafford, and Lisa Ortiz, she launched the vision in 2012, to prevent another mother's grief and another youth's lost life. As first responders, Bevelynn and her team provide support and resources to families affected by gun violence.

Yusef Miller is a County Wide Social Justice Activist, who has focuses that vary, from Sheriff and Police Reform, to community support against racism, sexism, and religious bigotry; just to name a few.

Congressman Scott Peters, first elected in 2012, serves California's 50th Congressional District. He has been a national leader on gun violence prevention, voting for every gun violence prevention measure that's come before Congress since 2013. He authored the STANDUP Act which is now law and focuses on suicide prevention training for schools, he broadcast the 2016 Democratic anti-gun violence sit-in from the House floor, and he read the names and ages of gun-violence victims on the House floor to highlight the human cost of Congress's persistent inaction.

Rabbi Devorah Marcus has been serving as Temple Emanu-El's Senior Rabbi since 2013. Central to her work as a rabbi are the concepts of building sacred community, being God's partners in repairing the world, and the acknowledgment that all people are created in God's image.
